Task One – Your Club


The first thing you will need to do is think about what your club or group should be about – what people would be doing when they meet up at the club, and when it would meet.

Task Three- Club Rules


Your club must have rules – you need to think about at least 5 rules that each member of the club must follow so that the club can be safe, fun and fair. Task Four – Advertising Your Club

Now you must create a poster advertising your club and why people must join it.
